"In Australia, there are varying and complex laws between the states," Genea Fertility Fertility Specialist Mathias Epee said. "Not everyone can become a sperm donor.

"To protect everyone involved – the intending parent or parents, any resulting children and the donor – sperm donors must comply with regulation."

Dr Epee said sperm donation must be altruistic and donors could only receive reasonable and verifiable reimbursement expenses they had incurred as part of the donation process.

"Donors must also consent to their identifying information to be placed on the Department of Health Reproductive Technology Treatment Registers," he said.

"A person conceived with the

assistance of a donor from 2004 onwards has the right to access identifying information about their donor once they have reached 16 years of age.

"Donors may also access identifying information where there is consent from all parties."

According to Dr Epee, the Donor Conception Information Service is designed to support and provide information to people who are donor conceived or participants in donor conception through a licensed fertility clinic in WA.

"In WA, donors are limited to a maximum of five families through donation, excluding their own," he said.

"There are no limits to the number of children conceived with the same donor within these five families"
